The children can either run or jog and ff implemented as per core principles, almost all children will be able to run for most, or all of, the way after around 4 weeks. This level of fitness will be maintained or improved over the coming months and years.

Conor McCusker P5 came second in the Front Crawl and third in the Butterfly.

The girls' team came third overall in the Freestyle Relay. Unfortunately, the Boys Freestyle team missed out on a medal and were unlucky not to finish in the top three overall.

The scoring system meant we won Best Overall School in a close contest with only five points separating an excellent Annahorish PS team and ourselves.

It was a week to remember for Nicole was also crowned Irish U10 Schools Champion in the Freestyle event held at the Aquatic Centre, Dublin. Brilliant achievement and as a school community we are extremely proud of her success.

SHARED EDUCATION

Our Shared Education partnership with Coagh PS continues to grow with great learning through the WAU Themes of 'Water' and 'Fairtrade' along with developing the pupils' ICT skills through Coding using Sphero Sprk+

Our P5 pupils continue to develop their understanding of WATER especially the importance of having clean water and experiencing the challenges of how some countries don't have instant access to clean water, with dirty water their only option. It highlights the serious consequences and also how they have to walk long distances to collect clean water to survive.

All P5 pupils also got opportunity to release Dollaghan trout fry into Ballinderry River. In groups they also sorted through river samples and tried to name all the different types of bugs which are found in the river. Thank you to Ballinderry Rivers Trust for organising the release.

Our P6/P7 pupils continue to develop their knowledge and understanding of FAIRTRADE comparing various Fairtrade and Non-Fairtrade products along with the advantages and disadvantages of Fairtrade.

With our ever changing digital world the pupils show great teamwork in all coding sessions through the use of Sphero Sprk+ and activity mats by programming the Sphero to make various journeys around the mats and by creating their own journeys using various materials and resources.

SOFT PROJECT -COOKSTOWN

The SOFT Project (Supporting Our Families Together) is a five-year school and community family programme funded by the Big Lottery's Reaching Out Supporting Families fund. The Speedwell Trust is the lead partner. SOFT brings children and young people together. The project works with primary schools, post primary schools and nursery school from all sectors across Cookstown and the surrounding area - Controlled, Maintained, Integrated and Irish Medium. They widen the network of support for children, young people and their families by co-operating with additional organisations across the community and statutory sectors. The size and scope of the project helps SOFT find and deliver the best possible service.

SOFT organises many workshops and courses throughout the year with lots of different programmes designed with family's needs in mind. It involves other partners in workshops and run some in-house. These include family bonding trips, children's and young people's events, trips, residentials and a summer scheme, reaching a wide audience. The programmes involve and work with people from all backgrounds, sharing, learning and growing together. The breadth and scope of diversity within the project is it's greatest strength. Ballylifford P.S. have been extremely fortunate to have SOFT Project partners in the school recently who delivered anxiety workshops for pupils with follow up information sessions for parents. They will visit the school again in May to deliver healthy eating and good food choices workshops for our P3 / P4 pupils with a follow up parent's session.

STRENGTH: LAB SUPERHEROES PROGRAMME



Strength: Lab Superheroes Programme

Superheroes organised by The Performance Lab Cookstown, is the movement curriculum that your school's pupils have been dreaming of, and one which will give them the solid foundations upon which to build their physical activity and competence. The goal of the program is not just to develop the children's physical literacy but to also support the teachers PE and physical literacy skills as well, so the program in the school becomes self-sustainable in the long term.

Put simply, it's a movement programme delivered through the medium of some of their favourite Superhero characters.

So all the squats are Ironman moves, crawls are Spiderman, Thor for lunges, Superman for planks and Hulk for burpees!

There are 24 movement patterns to be mastered in each of the five different disciplines. Each pupil has received a Superhero poster with all 24 levels and a passcode to login online to see the levels awarded to them by their assessors/teachers, video support for each movement pattern and league tables within their class, school, or area.

We are one of the lucky primary schools who are involved in the program and the feedback from the pupils has been extremely positive. They are also having lots of fun during the sessions and we encourage them to practise at home to further develop their skills and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

It is also a great opportunity for parents to get involved and join in with their children while practising at home!
