# Further Reopening Information: This information is in addition to our previous correspondence on reopening.

Thank you for your continued patience regarding plans for this academic year 2020-2021. I hope you and your family are well and are having opportunities to enjoy the remainder of the summer break.

Following the latest guidance from the Department of Education (Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> August) entitled 'New School Day' allowing all schools to return fully from September, please find below additional information you will need for your child/children returning to school outlining the structures and arrangements that we will be putting into place for the safe return of both our pupils and staff.

The arrangements have been discussed and approved by the Board of Governors and follow all the latest guidance to schools. I assure you that in making our arrangements, key considerations were and remain hygiene, safety, health and well-being of the whole school community. The Board of Governors have been actively considering all options as to how they can open the school safely for both pupils and staff.

Whilst we aim to follow the plan explained below as we reopen our school, it is important to highlight that all measures will be under review by the Principal and staff. This may be subject to change depending on the Department of Education issuing further guidance.

As the COVID-19 virus is still present and continues to have other implications on our everyday lives, it is important that we retain a degree of flexibility within our planning so that we can deal with any issues that may arise as we return to school.

There will be many changes to our school life, with our priority remaining the health, safety and well-being of all pupils, staff and school community. We are following the guidance and doing what we can to keep everyone safe and minimise the risks that we have identified. This will only be successful if we all play our part. We hope that these changes, whilst necessary, will still allow our pupils to have an enjoyable experience upon their return to school.

## **EDUCATION RESTART - KEY DATES**

Week beginning Monday 24th August 2020, P7 pupils will return to school from 9:00am to 12:00noon each day. P2-P6 pupils will return to school the same week in a phased approach.

Please refer to table below for times and dates week beginning Monday 24th August 2020 **ONLY.** With a phased approach for pupil return will allow for pupil preparation for New School Day and routines. For the month of September, we will be developing the area of well-being resilience with the children as part of their personal development. Outside agencies will also be involved in supporting pupils and staff return to school practices.

Each class in to meet their teacher and go through the new school day and routines during the week 24th - 28th August. This will help to prepare them for returning on the 1st September.

## **SCHOOL ARRIVAL TIMES**

- School will be open from 8:45am each day.
- Pupils may arrive at school between 8:45am 9:05am.
- Upon arrival, pupils must walk directly to their classroom where Teachers/Assistants will be present to greet the pupils as they arrive.
- Before entering the classroom, pupils must use the hand sanitiser provided.
- Parents/visitors are **not** permitted to enter the school building under any circumstances.
- Morning prayers will take place in the classrooms with their class teachers and not in the school hall as a whole school.

## **SCHOOL COLLECTION TIMES**

From Tuesday 1st September, school finishing times will be as follows.

- All children will be brought to the main playground by their class teacher at the end of the school day regardless of the weather.
- They will remain in their class groups and collected as normal as they see parents/carers arrive. Can we ask all parents/carers/family members to be punctual when collecting their child/children.

- Please do not congregate in groups, collect the children and move swiftly to your vehicle with awareness of other adults and children in the area. Adults should socially distance themselves from others.
- There will be NO parking allowed in the staff car park at school collection times. Only one
  gate will remain open to allow pedestrian access for parents/carers/family to collect the
  children.
- Please inform all adults that collect your child/ children of these arrangements.

## SCHOOL BREAK/LUNCH TIMES

- Whilst in school, all pupils will remain in a membership 'bubble' with their own class.
- Each class will eat their healthy break in the classroom and have their own period of outside play in a designated area of the playground during breaktime.
- It is essential that coats are brought to school by pupils every day. Pupils will be brought outside during breaktime, irrespective of the weather, to allow time away from the classroom. (Except in extreme circumstances).
- Pupils will follow a similar routine at lunchtime whereby they will eat their lunch in the school hall, followed by a period of play outside in a designated area of the playground with their own class.
- Pupils' healthy break and those taking packed lunch should bring their items of food in disposable wrapping or in a washable/wipeable container.
- All children need their own water bottle which will come into school every day. This bottle
  should be clearly labelled and thoroughly cleaned daily. Children will not be able to refill
  their bottles throughout the day.

#### SCHOOL UNIFORM

- Pupils will be required to wear full school uniform upon our return to school. Children are required to wear school uniform as usual and encouraged to change when they go home each day. We would encourage clean uniforms as often as possible.
- Cloakroom areas of school will be closed to pupils, so coats will be hung over the children's chairs.
- The PE curriculum will be delivered outside on dry days throughout the week. Children can
  wear their school PE clothing/half zips and school jerseys to school on these days and also
  every Friday.

## **EQUIPMENT AND PERSONAL BELONGINGS**

- Initially pupils will not be permitted to bring school bags, toys or any other items to school.
- All children should bring a pencil case with pencils, crayons/colouring pencils, rubber and a sharpener.
- Please ensure it all fits in the pencil case. It will remain in school and will be used only by them. We would encourage you to have a second well stocked pencil case at home for completing homework tasks

## **SCHOOL MEALS & TRANSPORT**

- School meals will resume on Tuesday 1st September 2020. Classes will eat their dinner/lunch in their class bubbles in the school dining hall.
- The free school meals payment system will continue until the end of August 2020.
- For those taking packed lunch, pupils should bring their items of food in disposable wrapping or in a washable/wipeable container/lunchbox (named) which are cleaned daily.
- School dinners cost £2.60 daily and £13 weekly (under review). Please send correct money in a sealed envelope/clear money bag/clingfilm as change can't be provided.

## IN CLASS ARRANGEMENTS

 In class pupils have their own allocated desk space which they will use throughout the school day; desks will be cleaned down at the end of each school day. Pupils should not bring items, such as toys, from home into school.

## **HOMEWORK**

- All main items of homework will be shared with the pupils online via the learning platform 'Seesaw'.
- Initially the term will begin with no homework this will be phased in as the term progresses we make arrangements as to how this can be done safely and to allow pupils and parents time to access 'Seesaw' and familiarise themselves with the platform.
- Information on how to access and use 'Seesaw' has been shared with parents. We would ask all parents to sign up and complete registration following the information sheet previously issued.

## SCHOOL COMMUNICATION

- It is important that school has the most up to date contact information for all our pupils and parents. You will be asked to complete a data capture information form which we will issue electronically to update our records accordingly.
- All communication with parents will be carried out via our school website, Schools NI app and our school Twitter account. We ask that all parents download and update the Schools NI app settings by sending test notification and restarting notifications on your mobile device in order to receive messages and updates from our messaging system.

## **FOREIGN HOLIDAYS - QUARANTINE**

If you have returned or are returning from a foreign holiday from a country which
requires quarantine, please contact the school to let us know that your children are in
isolation and the date they will be returning.

## **MEDICATION**

 Pupil medication e.g. inhalers should be brought into school on the first day back, these should be kept in school from that point in a sealed bag/container. Each classroom will have its own locked medical cabinet/storage for pupil medicines and medical information. Only staff have access to the cabinets/storage. Any new or updated medical information or reports should be shared immediately with the school.

## FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Following discussions with Rev. Fr Donnelly official arrangements for this year's First Holy Communion in Ballinderry Parish have been finalised.

First Communion will take the form of four separate masses over two weekends. Ballylifford PS will only have one mass celebration and Derrychrin PS will have three masses.

Ballylifford PS First Communion will take place on **Sunday 20th September** and Derrychrin PS will take place on Saturday 19th, Saturday 26th & Sunday 27th of September. All masses will begin at **12:00noon**.

Additional information has been issued to the parents of the children who will be celebrating their First Holy Communion.

## HEALTH AND SAFETY / COVID-19 PREVENTATION / PERSONAL HYGIENE

We consider the Health and Safety of our pupils, staff and wider school community to be of utmost importance. In line with Government suggestions, we have put the following measures in place.

## SOCIAL DISTANCING

- throughout the school building there will be signage to remind pupils, staff and parents of social distance requirements and hygiene practices to be used in school.
- It is important to remind parents/carers they cannot congregate at entrance or exit gates/doors. Adults should socially distance themselves from others.

## **PROTECTIVE BUBBLES**

 With consistent class membership - limiting contact between groups of children is the main risk mitigation measure for children attending school. These groups will not interact with other groups within the school.

## LIMITING VISITORS

- For everyone's safety, Parents and members of the public WILL NOT be allowed to enter into
  the school building unless in exceptional circumstances or by prior arrangement. Prior
  authorisation must be agreed by the Principal and it should be conducted safely, observing
  social distancing. This is of vital importance to protect and ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of everyone in our school and wider school community.
- If you need to speak to class teachers, we ask that you do so by telephone. We ask for your full co-operation with this requirement and please understand this is for the safety of all.
- We would like to make parents aware that if their child needs to be accompanied to school, only one parent should attend.

## **SANITISING STATIONS**

- Sanitisers will be placed at the main entrance, exit doors and all classroom doors. Children will be encouraged to use the hand sanitiser as well as full hand washing throughout the day.
- We would also encourage children to bring their own individual sanitiser which will remain in school.

## REGULAR HANDWASHING

- Promotion of regular and thorough attention to hygiene through regular hand washing and good respiratory hygiene, following the "Catch it, Bin it, Kill it" approach.
- Children will be requested by staff to wash their hands regularly throughout the school day.
- Children will wash their hands when they enter the classroom and will continue to wash their hands throughout the day e.g. before eating their break, when returning from outside after break, before eating their dinner, when returning from outside after dinner, before and after P.E, when requested to do so and before leaving at the end of the school day.
- It is essential that all children are reminded of the significance of personal hygiene as they return to school, particularly around the importance of regular handwashing. We encourage you to continue practising with your children the washing of hands for at least 20 seconds using liquid soap and water and drying them thoroughly.

## INDIVIDUAL LEARNING PACKS

• Children will only use their own personal equipment such as pencils and colouring pens/crayons. Parents will be asked to supply these at the start of the year in a wipeable pencil case and they will be remain in school.

# STAFF PPE

• School staff may wear PPE (such as visors, aprons or gloves) if they are required to work in close proximity with a child or to perform first aid if required.

## **COVID-19 SYMPTOMS**

 If your child is displaying any of the symptoms of COVID-19, they should remain at home and follow the latest Public Health advice.

# Symptoms of Covid-19 include:-

- > a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back, or;
- ➤ a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual), or:
- anosmia the loss or a change in your normal sense of smell (it can also affect your sense of taste)
- If any child presents as unwell, the school has a non-contact thermometer which may be
  used. The child will be brought to an individual room where they can wait in isolation with a
  member of staff while medical advice is sought, and parents/guardians contacted. The staff
  member will remain with the child until collected.
- Parents will be advised to follow the PHA guidance for households with possible coronavirus infection. If you have symptoms of coronavirus infection (COVID-19), however mild, do not leave your home for 10 days from when your symptoms started. This action will help protect others in your community while you are infectious. If you live with others and you or one of them have symptoms of coronavirus, then all other household members must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.
- If there is a confirmed case of someone in the school having the COVID-19 Virus, the school will follow the Department of Health's 'Test, trace and Protect' strategy. Therefore, the name and contact details of everyone who enters the school building will be recorded, including school staff, pupils, parents and visitors. We know that this is a lot of information and it is frustrating living at such a time of uncertainty where guidance is rapidly evolving. All arrangements will be kept under review and any changes or further guidance will be communicated to you as and when appropriate and/or necessary. I hope this information will assist you and your family in making arrangements. We would like to thank you for your understanding, patience and continued support at this time. The staff of Ballylifford look forward to meeting the children again as we embark on a new school year.
