Child Protection/Pastoral Care

At the beginning of each new academic year, class teachers always revise the pastoral care arrangements with children and remind them of whom they can talk to if they have any concerns or worries. In school we talk to all the children, particularly about our school safeguarding team, school safety net and Worry Box. These are on display in school and will be reinforced throughout the school year. <u>Anti-Bullying Week – Monday 15th</u> <u>November – Friday 19th November 2021</u>

The Anti-Bullying Week 2021 theme is "One Kind Word". This year Anti-Bullying week is week beginning 15th November. Children in all year groups will be concentrating on the definition, causes and effects of bullying and discussing anti-bullying strategies and procedures (More information will follow in November).



We will soon be selecting our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors for this year. These children will help educate their peers on bullying, lead anti-bullying campaigns, promote a culture which celebrates and tolerates difference and help keep their peers safe both online and offline.

Promoting Positive Behaviour
