Archbishop Martin States:

"Concerns have already been expressed in Ireland, and around the world, that the Synodal discussions could damage, rather than create, communion in the Church. Synodality is sometimes misunderstood as a kind of parliamentary, voting system where majority opinions might overturn longstanding Church tradition or core teaching.

To guard against this possibility, Pope Francis has emphasised in his book *Let us dream. The path to a better future*, that the Synodal journey must always be guided by the Holy Spirit, and have its foundation in the Word of God, in prayer and in adoration. He writes (p 84-85):

"What is under discussion at Synodal gatherings are not traditional truths of Christian doctrine. The Synod is concerned mainly with how teaching can be lived and applied in the changing contexts of our time... What characterises as a Synodal path is the role of the Holy Spirit".

It is vitally important that we work together here in Ireland to ensure that our ongoing Synodal journey will avoid divisiveness and polarisation of views, or degenerate into a kind of "them and us" adversarial process which loses sight of our shared belonging within the Church of Christ."

Parish Envelopes
